1. The Explanatory Statement setting out material facts, pursuant to Section 102 of the Companies Act, 2013, Secretarial Standards-2 on General Meetings, in respect of the Special Business under Item Nos. 5 to 6 of the accompanying Notice is annexed hereto.
2. A MEMBER ENTITLED TO ATTEND AND VOTE AT THE MEETING IS ENTITLED TO APPOINT A PROXY TO ATTEND AND VOTE INSTEAD OF HIMSELF/HERSELF AND THE PROXY NEED NOT BE A MEMBER OF THE COMPANY. THE PROXIES, IN ORDER TO BE VALID AND EFFECTIVE, MUST BE DELIVERED AT THE REGISTERED OFFICE OF THE COMPANY AT LEAST 48 HOURS BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE MEETING. A PROXY SO APPOINTED SHALL NOT HAVE ANY RIGHT TO SPEAK AT THE MEETING.
3. A person can act as a proxy on behalf of members not exceeding fifty (50) and holding in the aggregate not more than ten percent (10%) of the total share capital of the Company. A member holding more than ten percent (10%) of the total share capital of the Company may appoint a single person as proxy and such person shall not act as a proxy for any other person or shareholder. Proxies submitted on behalf of the Companies, LLP, Societies etc., must be supported by an appropriate resolution/authority, as applicable issued on behalf of the nominating organization. A Proxy Form is annexed to this Notice.
4. Corporate Members are requested to send a duly certified copy of the Board Resolution, pursuant to Section 113 of the Companies Act, 2013, authorising their representative to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting.

In case of joint holders attending the meeting, the joint holder who is highest in the order of names will be entitled to vote at meeting.

To fill the vacant position of the Directors, shareholders of the company may file nominations for the post of Directors along with fee of Rs. 1,00,000 by way of Cheque/DD (which shall be refunded to such member, if the person proposed gets elected as a Director or gets more than twenty-five (25) per cent of total valid votes cast on such resolution) up to 8th September, 2022 (Thursday) till 05:00 P.M. at the Registered Office of the Company. As per the Regulation 15A of the SEBI (Stock Brokers and Sub-Brokers) (Amendment) Regulations, 2003, any person who is registered as the Authorised Person with LSC Securities Limited cannot be appointed as the Director of the Company. As per the guidelines of NSE and Metropolitan Stock Exchange of India Limited (MSEI), any person who is registered as the Authorised Person with any Trading Member of NSE/Metropolitan Stock Exchange of India Limited (MSEI) respectively, shall not be eligible to be appointed as the Director of the Company.
8. The requirement to place the matter relating to appointment of Auditors for ratification by Members at every Annual General Meeting is done away vide **Notification S.O. 1833(E) dated 7th May 2018** issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, New Delhi. Accordingly, no resolution is proposed for ratification of appointment of Auditors, who were appointed at 20th Annual General Meeting held on 31st August, 2019 for the period of 5 (five) consecutive years from conclusion of 20th Annual General Meeting till the conclusion of 25th Annual General Meeting.

Explanatory statement pursuant to section 102(1) of the companies act, 2013 (the "ACT")

The following statement sets out all material facts relating to the Special Business mentioned in the accompanying Notice.

Item No. 05 and 06

Keeping in view the existing and future financial requirements to support the business operations, the Company may need additional funds. For this purpose, the Company may, from time to time, raise finance from various Banks and/or Financial Institutions and/ or any other lending institutions and/or Corporates (including its Holding Company), Bodies Corporate and/or such other persons/ individuals as may be considered fit, which, together with the moneys already borrowed by the Company (apart from temporary loans obtained from the Company's bankers in ordinary course of business) which may exceed the aggregate of the paid-up share capital, free reserves and securities premium of the Company.

Pursuant to Section 180(1)(c) of the Companies Act, 2013, the Board of Directors can exercise such powers only with the approval of Members of the Company by way of passing Special Resolution in general meeting. Having regard to Company's requirement of funds, the consent of the members is sought for increasing the said borrowing limit from Rs.20 Crores (Rupees Twenty Crores) to Rs. 50 (Rupees Fifty Crores) only.

In order to facilitate securing the borrowing in any form made by the Company, it would be necessary to create charge and/or mortgage and/or and/or hypothecation and/or pledge and/or assignments and/or lien on all or any other movable and/or immovable properties of the Company both present and/or future.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 180(1)(a) of the Companies Act, 2013, the consent of the shareholders is sought for authorising the Board to create mortgage and/or charge and/or hypothecation and/or pledge over the property of the Company, both present and future to secure the borrowings or financial assistance upto an aggregate amount not exceeding Rs. 50.00 Crores (Rupees Fifty Crores) only.

Accordingly, the approval of the Members is sought for passing Special Resolution(s) as set out at Item No. 05 and 06 of the Notice.

The Directors recommend the Special Resolution(s) as set out at Item No. 05 and 06 of the accompanying Notice, for members' approval.

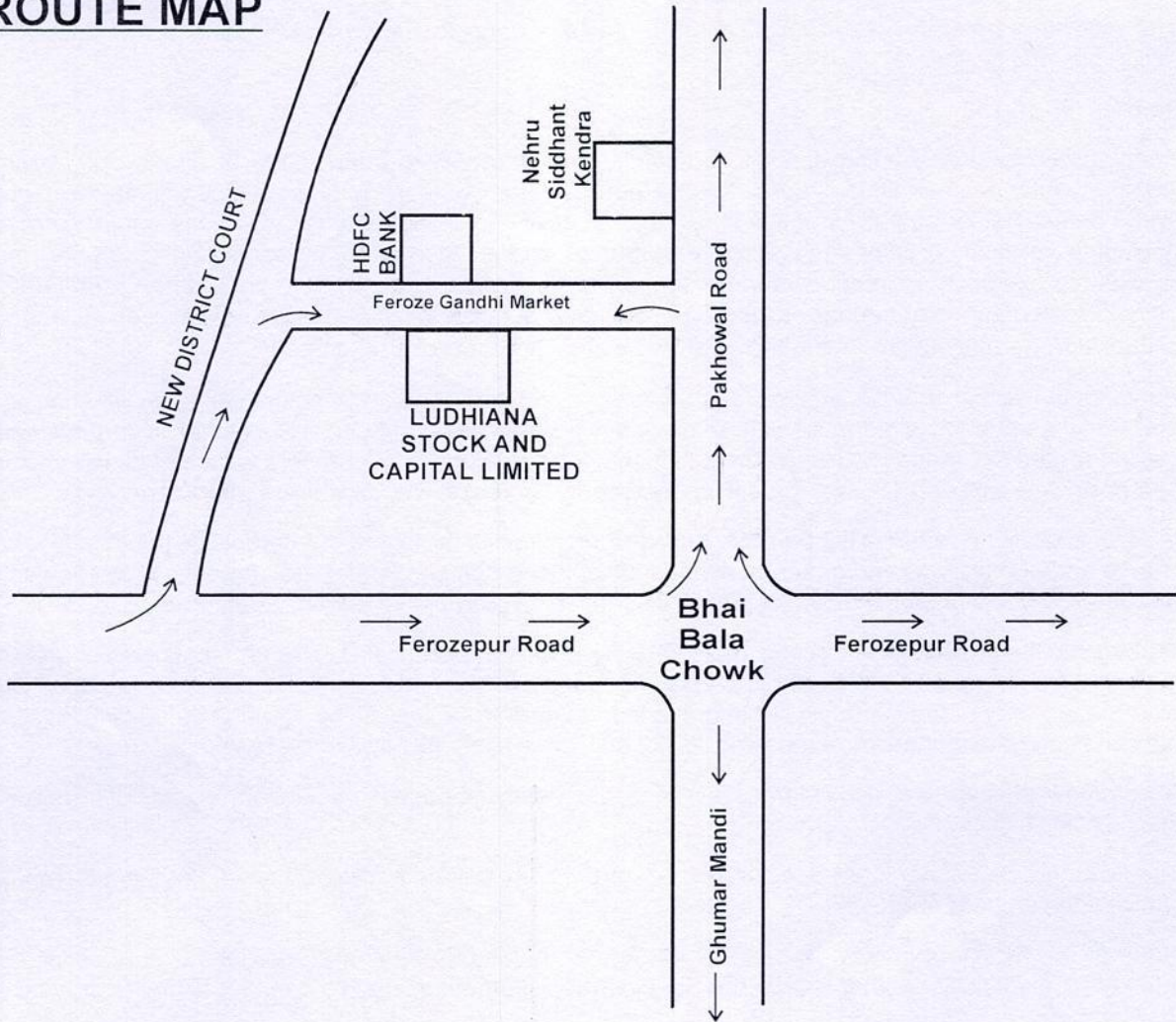

Your directors are pleased to present the Twenty Third (23rd) Annual Report on the business and operations of the Company along with the Audited Financial Statements for the financial year ended 31st March, 2022.

BUSINESS OVERVIEW AND STATE OF THE COMPANY'S AFFAIRS

a) Trading at NSE and BSE in Capital Market Segment

During the year under review, your Company has recorded a business volume of ₹18251.62 Crores (Previous year ₹10775.63 Crores) and ₹4148.16 Crores (Previous year ₹2043.64 Crores) in Capital Market Segment of the NSE and the BSE, respectively.

b) F&O Segment of NSE

During the year under review, your Company has recorded a business volume of ₹20738.15 Crores (Previous year ₹16535.93 Crores) in the Futures & Options Segment of NSE Limited.

c) Currency Segment of NSE

During the year under review, the business volume in Currency Derivatives Segment was ₹445.51 Crores (Previous year ₹762.52 Crores) in NSE.

d) Depository Participant Services

During the year under review, your Company has opened 1798 new accounts (previous year 1429 accounts opened) in CDSL and 307 accounts (previous year 316 accounts opened) in NSDL.

e) Stock Broking Services

During the year under review, your Company has opened 2391 Trading Accounts (previous year 1309 accounts opened).

FUTURE OUTLOOK

As 2021 was coming to a close, there was optimism in the air. India was gearing up for a strong economic recovery—several forecasters such as the International Monetary Fund expected growth to exceed 9% this financial year. This optimism received a jolt early this year as a wave of omicron infections swept through the country (which, thankfully, did not last long), and then in February, Russia invaded Ukraine. These events aggravated the preexisting challenges such as surging inflation, supply shortages, and shifting geopolitical realities across the world with no definite end in sight. And the subsequent confluence of headwinds such as surging commodity prices and disruption in trade and financial transactions quickly deteriorated economic fundamentals that were trending up a few months back. Consequently, this has compelled us to temper our growth expectations.

However, the Nation believes the risks are not strong enough to deny India an economic rebound given the domestic demand potential. It is expected that India will grow by 7.1%–7.6% in FY22–23 and 6%–6.7% in FY23–24. This will ensure that India reigns as the world's fastest-growing economy over the next few years, driving world growth even as several major economies brace themselves for a slowdown or possibly a recession.

DIVIDEND AND RESERVES

The Board, in its meeting held on 17th August, 2022 has recommended a dividend @ 2.25% (i.e. Rs. 0.225/- per equity shares of Rs.10/- each) on paid up share capital for the year ended 31st March, 2022. The proposal is subject to the approval of the shareholders at the ensuing Annual General Meeting to be held on 23rd September, 2022. The total dividend declared for the current year is 14.49 Lakhs.

The dividend, if approved at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting, will be paid to those shareholders whose name shall appear in the Register of Members of the Company as on 20th September, 2022 or Register of Beneficial Owners, maintained by the Depositories as at the close of 20th September, 2022.

During the year under review, it is proposed not to transfer any amount to General Reserve of the Company.

MATERIAL CHANGES AND COMMITMENTS

There are no instances of material changes and commitments in terms of the information required under Sub-section (3)(l) of Section 134 of the Companies Act, 2013, affecting the financial position of the Company which have occurred between the end of the financial year to which the Financial Statements relate and the date of the Director's Report.

CHANGE IN REGISTERED OFFICE OF THE COMPANY

During the period under review, the Registered office of the Company was shifted from Union Territory of Chandigarh to State of Punjab w.e.f. 1st October, 2021 pursuant to the orders of Regional Director (Northern Region). The jurisdiction of Registrar of Companies i.e. Registrar of Companies, Punjab and Chandigarh remain the same.

Presently, the Registered office of the Company is First Floor, Ludhiana Stock Exchange Building, Feroze Gandhi Market, Ludhiana-141001.

CAPITAL STRUCTURE

During the period under review, there was no change in the Capital Structure of the Company.

22 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

22.1 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

• **ACCOUNTING CONVENTION**

The accompanying financial statements are prepared and presented under the historical cost convention, on the basis of accounting principles and comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules 2006 as amended by Companies (Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules 2016, the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Schedule III to the Act.

• **REVENUE RECOGNITION**

- a) The Company follows accrual system of accounting in accordance with the normally accepted accounting principles. Income in respect of zero holding depository accounts is accounted for at the time of reasonable certainty of its collection.
- b) Income from Turnover Charges on Stock Broking business is recognized as per contracted rates at the execution of transactions on behalf of customers on the trade date and is reflected net of expenses for Turnover Charges and GST.
- c) Interest Income is recognized using time proportion method.
- d) Dividend income is recognized when the right to receive payment is established.

• **PROPERTY PLANT AND EQUIPMENT**

Property Plant and Equipment are stated at historical cost less depreciation. The cost of Property Plant and Equipment comprises purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use.

• **INTANGIBLE ASSETS AND AMORTIZATION**

Intangible assets of the Company such as software and software licenses are amortized on straight line basis over a period of 5 years, being the useful life as estimated by the management, beginning with the year in which the said assets are put to use.

• **DEPRECIATION**

Depreciation is provided on written down value method as per the requirements prescribed in schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013 on all the assets of the Company. In respect of assets sold, depreciation is provided up to the date of disposal. The useful life of Property Plant and Equipment has been taken to be the life as prescribed under Schedule II. However the useful life of computer software and licenses has been estimated by the management and taken to be five years and being amortized over the said period on straight line basis. The residual value and useful life of the Property Plant and Equipment of the company have been reviewed at the end of Financial Year and there is no difference of expectations from the previous estimates and the same i.e. the residual value and useful life of Property Plant and Equipment, as estimated as per Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013, is in accordance with AS-5 prescribed by the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules 2006 as amended by Companies (Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules 2016.

• **INVENTORIES**

Inventories are valued at cost and cost for the same is determined on the basis of FIFO method.

• **EMPLOYEE BENEFITS**

DEFINED CONTRIBUTION PLAN

Contributions to Provident Fund and Employees State Insurance are recognized in the accounts as per the statutory requirements under the relevant Act.

DEFINED BENEFIT PLAN

- a. Gratuity: The Company makes contribution to a scheme administered by the Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) to discharge gratuity liabilities to the employees. The Company accounts its liability for future gratuity benefits based on independent actuarial valuation as at the balance sheet date, using Projected Unit Credit Method.
- b. Leave Encashment: The eligible employees are permitted to carry forward certain number of their annual

leave entitlement to subsequent years, subject to a ceiling. Company also provides for the encashment of leave subject to rules. The liability is provided on the number of days of unutilized leave at each balance sheet date, based on actuarial valuation.

• **INVESTMENT**

Investments that are readily realizable and are intended to be held for not more than one year from the date, on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long term Investments are stated at investments. Current Investments are stated at lower of cost and fair value. Long term investments are stated at cost of acquisition. Provision for diminution is made when such diminution is considered other than temporary in nature. Valuation is determined on the basis of each category of investments.

• **TAXATION**

- a. Current tax is determined on the profit for the year in accordance with the provisions of the Income tax Act, 1961.
- b. Deferred tax is calculated at the rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted as of the Balance Sheet date and is recognized on timing difference that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax assets, subject to consideration of prudence, are recognized and carried forward only to the extent that they can be realized.

• **EARNING PER SHARE**

The company reports basic and diluted earnings per share (EPS) in accordance with accounting standard 20 on "Earnings Per Share". Basic EPS is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted EPS is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year as adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares, except where the results are anti-dilutive.

• **IMPAIRMENT OF ASSETS**

At each Balance Sheet an assessment is made whether any indication exists that an asset has been impaired. If any such indication exists, an impairment loss i.e. the amount by which the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount is provided in the books of account. The recoverable amount of assets exceeds carrying amount of assets and as such there is no impairment of assets.

• **PROVISIONS, CONTINGENT LIABILITIES AND CONTINGENT ASSETS**

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be outflow of resources. Contingent Liabilities are not recognized, but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.
